

Wednesday, March 2, 1921.

The Board met in regular session, all the Commissioners present, the Commissioners and Chairman A. L. Cox presiding.

Bids for furnishing oils for the county were during February 1921 were received from 3 sources - the Standard Oil Co., the Mutual Oil Co. and H. O. Woodland. After examining the bids, the Board, upon motion duly made, seconded & passed, authorized the submission of the bids to Mr. Jas. Wighton, engineer on road work, for determination.

The board received the following communication:

Leocompton, Kansas, Feb 28, 1921.

To the Hon. Board of County Commissioners of Douglas Co., Kansas.

Gentlemen: On account of sickness, which makes it impossible for me to go elsewhere for special treatment, I hereby tender my resignation as trustee of Leocompton Township, to which position I was elected last November, & also resign as Deputy Assessor, to which post I was appointed January 10, 1921, to take effect at once.

Upon motion duly made, seconded & passed, the resignation of Mr. F. P. Shirley as trustee of Leocompton Township and as Deputy Assessor for the same district, was accepted.

By motion duly made, seconded & passed, Mr. Walter O. McClanahan was appointed trustee for Leocompton Township; & upon recommendation of the County Assessor he also was named trustee & as Deputy Assessor for Leocompton Township. The board approved his bond as deputy assessor.

A communication from M. W. Watson, State Highway Engineer, announced approval of the selection of Mr. R. D. Klise as Resident Engineer for Douglas county on Project #7, Federal Aid Road district No. 5.

X At 2 o'clock the board received & opened bids for purchasing \$100,000 Douglas County Road Improvement bonds. Three bids were received. One from the Shawnee Investment Co. of Topeka, whose bid, ~~was~~ was for, less \$5,230 for series rendered in printing, registering & disposing of the issue. A second bid was from the Fidelity National Bank & Trust Co. of Kansas City, Mo., whose bid was for, less \$5,885.00 as expense & commission.
