

Monday April 4 - 1921

The board met this date for the first day of the April session. All the commissioners were present, and Commissioner and Chairman A. L. Cox presided.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and passed, the board adopted the following preamble and resolution: to wit:

Whereas, by virtue of proper petitions and orders the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas has obtained permission for the construction of a permanent road in Douglas County known as the Fort to Fort Highway and have proceeded to the construction of the same and

Whereas, duly approved estimates of cost of such permanent road have been filed in the office of the County Clerk of Douglas County, which estimates show that the total approximate cost of said improvement will be in the sum of \$845,083.87,

Whereas, the amount of all donations, subscriptions, state aid or federal aid that have been granted or promised on account of said improvement is in the sum of \$274,342.50

Whereas, said Douglas County has heretofore authorized and issued its negotiable bonds in the aggregate amount of \$300,000.00 for the purpose of paying a portion of the cost of the construction of said improvements, and

Whereas, said Board of County Commissioners have found, and do hereby find that it is necessary that Douglas County issue, deliver and sell forthwith its bonds in the additional sum of \$100,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds to pay the cost of said road, which said \$100,000.00 of bonds together with the \$300,000.00 heretofore issued, does not exceed the total estimated cost of improving same to be assessed against Douglas County and the townships included in the benefit district through which said road passes, and

Whereas, said Board of Commissioners hereby finds and declares that all acts, conditions and things required to be done by the Constitution and laws of the State of Kansas precedent to the issuance of \$100,000.00 of bonds at this time for the purpose aforesaid, have existed, happened and been properly done and performed in legal and due form, time and manner as required by law, and said issue does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation of the State of Kansas.
