Upon a showing that she was excessively assessed the board ordered a reduction of \$1100.00 on the assessed valuation of Edna Jones admx. of the estate of Thomas Jones.

The board received the following petition, to wit:

Lawrence, Kansas May 24th 1921

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas.

Your petitioner represents that he is one of the owners of that tract of land known as the west one fourth of South one half of Block number six, North Lawrence in the city of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas, that the tract of land formerly known Lawrence and described as the North west quarter of South west quarter of block six (less Rail Road) and South west quarter of South west quarter of block 6 less Rail Road is included in a-lore described land. That Douglas County by virtue of deed recorded in book 61 page 258 and book 61 page 416 of the office of the Register of deeds office of Douglas County, Kansas, conveyed their right title and interest in and to said last described tracts of land to Anna E. M. Menger.

That there appear on the tax rolls certain taxes prior to said conveyances which are no longer a lien on said premises. Your petitioner hereby offers the sum of twenty five dollars for an assignment or cancellation of said taxes.
