Wednesday, May 25, 1921

The board met this day as a board of Equalization to hear complaints from the City of Lawrence.

The application of Geo. W. Krumm for a reduction in valuation of real estate improvements was partly granted, the board allowing him a reduction of \$250 on a valuation of \$2200.00.

The board also heard the complaints of Albert Slathart who had been assessed \$500.00 on real estate improvements, by granting his request for a reduction of the full amount assessed, upon Mr. Slathart's statement that the improvements assessed had cost not to exceed \$50.00.

Upon a proper showing and by order of the State Tax Commission the board ordered a cancellation on personal property appearing in the name of J. W. Hyre on the 1920 City of Lawrence tax roll amounting to \$16.36 on a valuation of \$600.00 due to double assessment on the same property.

Thursday, May 26, 1921
