

Resolution further consideration and action as provided by Chapter 92
Continued of The Laws of Kansas of 1921, and

Whereas, Upon due consideration of said resolution by
The Board of County Commissioners of The County of Douglas,
Kansas, it is found that said resolution is in due
form, and that the proposed improvement is a public
necessity.

Therefore, Be it resolved by The Board of County Com-
missioners of the County of Douglas, Kansas, and it is
hereby declared by said Board that the proposed im-
provement, to wit: The paving of North Seventh Street
along the general line of said street from the intersect-
ion of said street with Locust Street north to the north
City limits, the said street to be paved or otherwise
improved at a width of eighteen feet with such width
at curves as good engineering practice may require,
the said paving to be constructed of concrete according
to plans and specification to be prepared by The City
Engineer, is a public utility.

Be it further resolved, That as none of said street
to be improved lies outside the City limits of The City
of Lawrence, Kansas, no benefit district need be created
by this Board.

Be it further resolved, That final action on the pro-
posed improvement shall be taken on the 13th day of July,
A. D. 1921, and that notice be given in the official County
paper for two consecutive weeks commencing with the issue
of June 22nd 1921, that on said 13th day of July, A. D. 1921,
this Board will hear complaints and such protests as may
be filed against the proposed improvement.

The following is the text of resolution as passed June
17, 1921, by The Board of Commissioners of The City of
Lawrence, to wit:

Whereas, The Board of Commissioners of The City of Lawrence,
Kansas, which is a city of the second class, located in Douglas
County, Kansas, and having a population of less than 65,000
inhabitants, deems it expedient and advisable and a public
necessity to grade, curb, gutter, pave or otherwise improve
North Seventh Street in said City of Lawrence, formerly known
as Maine Street in that part of said City known as North Lawrence,
from Locust Street north to the north city limits, in order
to connect said Locust Street, which is a paved street,
