Joint Board. Upon motion duly made, seconded & passed, the joint board adjourned to meet August 27-1921-10 o'clock a.m.

Adjourns. After the adjournment of the joint board, the Board of County Commissioners resumed this session.

Court House. The board ordered a complete cessation of business in all County offices from noon of Friday, Aug. 12-1921, until such times as funeral services for the late John E. Moss, Clerk of the District Court for Douglas County, were completed concluded.

Order. The board took up the matter of change in County road petitioned for by the State Bank of Emporia & 55 others, & by petition duly taken, authorized the striking from the list of County roads the following described part of a road, to wit: "Beginning at the intersection of 7th street, extended, in Emporia, with the west line of Section 4, Twp. 13, Range 21, thence east one mile to the section line between sections 3 & 4, said township & range, thence south on said section line to the northeast corner of Section 9, Township 13, Range 21," & initial thereof place upon the list of County roads the following described road, to wit: "Beginning at the northeast corner of Section 9, Twp. 13, R. 21, thence east on the north line of said section to the northeast corner thereof & joining the present County road at said point." The change to be effective upon the following conditions, namely: That the bridge across the creek flowing northward between the C. F. Richards place & the farm of A. F. Davis be lengthened eight (8) feet, that the road on both the east & west sides of this bridge be widened to conform to the lengthened condition of the bridge (eight feet wide), that the well now being sunk near the northeast corner of City Park be completed, & that the rest room (or cottage) now being building or in contemplation be completed ready for occupancy. By a vote of 2 yeas & 1 no the board authorized the change in County roads when the conditions enumerated above shall have been complied with, otherwise the road to remain as at present.

Owing to a change in the laws governing the sale of delinquent taxes, be in order to conform to Chapter 288 of the Session Laws of 1921, the board, by motion duly made, seconded & passed, unanimously

Resolution adopted the following resolution, to wit:

Resolved, That this county accept & adopt the provisions of the act of the Legislature of 1921, entitled, "An act regulating the sale of real estate for delinquent taxes, in such counties as shall accept & adopt the provisions of this act."

Claims against the County were presented, and it was allowed, for which see August 11th record.
