

the doing of said improvement.

And be it further ordered, that said contract be entered on behalf of said joint board by the chairman of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Douglas, Kansas, and by the Mayor of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, upon said contractor, the G. R. Young Construction Co., giving bond at the contract price, and upon said bond being approved, as is provided in Section 5 of Chapter 92 of the Session Laws of Kansas of 1921.

And be it further ordered, that upon said contract being fully entered the bond being given as above provided, that said proposed improvement under said contract shall be conducted under the supervision of the City Engineer of the City of Lawrence, Kansas.

And be it further ordered, that a copy of the minutes of the joint board above be recorded at length upon the records of the County Clerk of Douglas County, Kansas, and of the City Clerk of Lawrence, Kansas.

Joint Bd. Upon motion duly made, seconded and passed the joint board adjourned.

The board met this date in Regular Session, all the Commissioners present, the Commissioners and Chairman A. L. Cox presiding.

Meeting Bureau A delegation representing the Douglas County Farm Bureau appeared before the board and asked that the tax levy made August 15-1921, of .02 per mill for the support of the bureau be increased. The board refused the request.

Delegation representing both sides of the question of changing the route of the County road leading out from the City of Endora, appeared before the board, one delegation upholding the action of the board at their session of August 10, 1921, at which time a change in the County road was authorized, and the other delegation asking that the action of the board on that date be rescinded as it related to the change in the County road, be rescinded. At the conclusion of the hearing the board referred the entire matter to the County attorney, he to report his findings at a later meeting.

Authorize By motion duly made, seconded and passed, the board authorized an increase in charges by the sheriff for meals furnished prisoners from 60 cents per day to 70 cents per day for each prisoner, the increased rate applying from September 1-1921.
