

Tuesday - Sept. 6, 1921 -

The board met this date for the first day of the September session, all the Commissioners were present, the Commissioner the Chairman A. L. Cox presided.

Report The claim of Bee Memorial Hospital, in amount \$54.00, for maintenance the Medical Care of Manford Biebin, was by motion duly made, seconded and passed, the board not having authorized his acceptance into the hospital.

Claims against the County were presented, audited, and allowed, for which see September Allowance Record.

Wednesday, September 7, 1921 -

The board met in adjourned regular session, all the Commissioners present, the Commissioner the Chairman A. L. Cox presiding.

The monthly reports of the Commissioners of the Poor and the Superintendent of the County Home and Farm, were received, and approved and appeared.

The board, by motion, made, seconded and passed, accepted the offer of \$78.00, which represented tax for the year 1917-1918-1919 and 1920, on lot 109 Elm street, North Lawrence, and lots 101 and 145 in addition No. 3 - also North Lawrence, made by Mrs. J. D. Brownson, as abated accrued and are costs against the Lawrence above mentioned lots.

By motion duly made, seconded and passed, the board adopted the following resolution:

Whereas, it appears that the following described real estate, Order to wit: "Beginning at a point 125' west of the N.W. corner of the property intersection of Ohio and Hancock streets, in the City of Lawrence, Platted in Douglas County, Kansas, thence West 125', thence North 75' thence east 125', thence South 75' to beginning," being in the S.H. # of Dec. 31-1920, List together with all pictures, furniture and equipment now on said property is now owned by the Phi Kappa of the Alpha American Pi Society; and Whereas, said above described real estate is now sold by said society for the purposes mentioned in Section 11153 of the General Statutes of Kansas for 1915, now, therefore, be it
