

Thursday Nov. 10 - 1921

The board met in adjourned regular session, all members being present, and Commissioner and Chairman A. J. Cox presiding.

By motion duly made seconded, and passed, the board made the following order and resolution for the construction of certain hard surface work on Sec. A, Federal Project No. 7, Fort to Fort Highway, by day labor, to-wit:

Now upon this 10th day of November, 1921 at a duly constituted and regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, a majority of the members being present, the matter of the construction of Federal Aid Project No. 7, Section A, in Douglas County, Kansas comes up for final consideration and action, and the board having carefully considered the matter of said construction is of the opinion that the same can be constructed by the County's forces under what is known as the day labor system at a lower cost and with better satisfaction than can be secured by awarding a contract.

It is therefore now by said board ordered and resolved that the Board of County Commissioners of said Douglas County, Kansas, shall take charge of and construct the improvement of the road known as Section A, Federal Aid Project No. 7, Douglas County, Kansas in conformity with the profile, plans and specifications as filed with the County Clerk and approved by the State Highway Engineer and that said Board of County Commissioners will perform said work by the Day Labor System under the supervision of the State Highway Commission of Kansas.

Be it further resolved that the work shall be in charge of a competent resident engineer to be appointed by the State Highway Commission and who shall report to and receive orders from the State Highway Engineer of Kansas. Further, that the salary and expenses of said resident engineer shall be paid from the improvement funds of said project.

Be it further resolved that the Board of County Commissioners will purchase or otherwise procure to the satisfaction of the State Highway Commission such machinery, tools and other appliances as are necessary for the proper construction of said road and shall procure and furnish all the necessary materials and labor required to carry on said construction and to do such other things and make such expenditures as may further be necessary for the improvement and construction of said road aforesaid.

Be it further resolved that five certified copies of this order and resolution be submitted to the State Highway Commission for their approval and the County Clerk is hereby directed to
