The board met in adjourned regular session, all the commissioners present, and Commissioner and Chairman A. L. Cox presiding.

Claims against the county were presented, audited and allowed, for which see December Allowance Record. The monthly reports of the Poor Commissioner and the Supt. Monthly for County Home & Farm were received, audited and approved.

Wednesday, Dec. 7, 1921.

The board met in adjourned regular session, all commissioners present, and Commissioner and Chairman A. L. Cox presiding.

The board, upon recommendation of the county assessor ordered a refund to Earl Higgins in amount \$9.39, owing to erroneous personal property assessment.

The board also ordered a cancellation of taxes assessed against the American Cement Co. on the 1921 tax roll, on a valuation of \$1,401,085, amounting in taxes to \$46,165.75 due to erroneous assessment in that the personal property of the company in various localities had not been deducted on the original assessment sheet, which by law the company was permitted to do.

Claims against the county were presented, audited and allowed, for which see December Allowance Record.

The board, upon recommendation of the Co. Assessor, ordered a cancellation of tax against B. F. Critch, appearing on the 1921 tax roll, in amount \$7.29, owing to failure of Dethy Assessor to add constitutional exemption of \$200 & because of a tax of \$7.29 on a dog not owned by Mr. Critch.
