

Tuesday, Jan. 2, 1922.

The Board met this date for the first day of the January session. All the Commissioners were present and Commissioner Chairman G. L. Cox presided.

The clerk read the Minutes of the Board meetings for December, and upon motion duly made, seconded and passed, they were approved.

Upon recommendation of the County Health Officer & County Medical Physician, the Board directed that James Jacobs of 911 New Jersey Street, St. Louis, be sent to St. Louis, where Fred Miller, 425 Alabama St., St. Louis, be recommended to Belle Memorial Hospital, Rosedale, Kansas, for a period of 3 (three) weeks at the expense of the County.

The claim of Arin L. Isaac, deputy clerk of the Court, in amount \$50.00, for extra services during the session of the Court, was upon motion duly made, seconded and passed, approved by the Board.

The Board approved the bond of H. H. McKone, County Treasurer, in amount \$25,000, with the New Amsterdam Casualty Company, of New York as Surety, and during the 2-year period for which he was bonded.

Upon recommendation of the County Assessor the Board directed the Clerk to issue a cancellation order to H. S. Parker, appearing on the 1921 Tax roll with an assessment of \$150.00 against him, upon which there was a tax of \$4.94, account failure of deputy assessors to give him the Constitutional \$200 exemption.

Claims allowed against the County were presented and audited and allowed, for which see January Allowance Record.

The clerk was instructed to prepare copy for publication in the official County paper calling for bids for the construction of one 108-ft. bridge on steel spans in two 30-ft. steel approaches over the Wakarusa River about 7 miles southeast of Lawrence, together with all the work involved and indicated by the plans & specifications. It was determined by the Board that proposals for this work would be received until 2:00 o'clock p.m. of January 26, 1922, at this point.

The clerk called attention of the Board to the fact that 1922 was the additional year in which real estate was assessed, he asked that he be granted additional office help to handle the work. The matter was discussed by the Board, and after help for making Section 1, Chapter 196, Session Laws of Kansas 1919, upon suggestion of Commissioner Cox was by motion duly made, seconded and passed, the Board authorized the County Clerk to employ, from time to time, such additional County clerical help as would be necessary to properly & efficiently take care of the work, done both in the office of County Clerk and in the office of County Assessor.
