

Wednesday, January 11-1922

The board met in adjourned regular session, all the Commissioners present, the Commissioner as Chairman G. L. Cox presiding.

The board approved the bond of the Lawrence National Bank, in amount \$15,000, issued by the Bankers Deposit Guaranty & Surety Company, of Topeka, Kansas, effective from January 1, 1922, to December 31, 1922.

The board ordered a cancellation of interest and fees charged against Ray D. Stewart, on the N. E. of the S. E. of Section 18-15-19, interest in amount \$3.80, owing to error in forwarding bank by making a wrong description.

By Motion duly made, seconded and passed, the board adopted the following resolution, to wit:

Be it hereby resolved, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session this 11th day of January, 1922, that the following property be placed on the tax list of Douglas County, said property being described as follows, to wit: "Commence at a point 125 ft. south of the southeast corner of lot No 7 in block #5, Roberts's Addition to the City of Lawrence, thence south 75 ft., thence West 102 ft., thence south 17.2 ft., thence west 33.5 ft., thence north 17.2 ft., thence West 54.5 ft., thence north 75 ft., thence east 190 ft. to place of beginning, in City of Lawrence, Kansas."

That said property be placed on said list for the following reasons: said property being owned by and in the name of the Phi Beta Psi fraternity of the University of Kansas, said fraternity being a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Kansas, said property being used by said fraternity as a chapter house and grounds, therefore said premises come within the same category as under the same rate as all other fraternity houses at the University of Kansas, and therefore being exempt from taxation.

By Motion duly made, seconded and passed, the board adopted the following scale of wages for road work, effective from and after March 1, 1922, to wit:

Road Work Single hand, per hour, 20 cents.

Double " " " 50 cents.

Bridge and Culvert work, single hand, per hour, 35 cents.

The following rates on patrol work, by dogman, shall be effective from and after March 1, 1922, to wit:

Single dogging, per hour, 35 cents.

Man and team, " " 55 cents.

Single dogging, \$1.00 per mile.

Claims against the county are presented, audited and allowed, for which see January 22nd 1922.
