

Saturday, April 15 - 1922.

The board met in regular session. Commissioners Steele and Kretzinger present. Commissioner Cox absent owing to sickness. Commissioner and Chairman Robt. Steele presided.

Appraisal The board approved the dates designated by the County Assessor to be held in copy of advertisement which will be first published April 19, 1922. during which the board will act as a board of equalization to adjust values in real and personal properties, and to correct errors. The dates designated for the various taxing districts follow to wit:

May 15 - Grant Township and Kanwaka Township.

May 16 - Calverton Township, Leocompton Township, Leocompton City.

May 17 - Eudora Township, Eudora City.

May 18 - Marion Township, Willow Springs Township.

May 19 - Palmyra Township, Baldwin City.

May 20 - Wakarusa Township.

May 22-23, 24, 25 - City of Lawrence.

Appraisal The board approved the depositories funds of the Merchants National Bank and of the Merchants Loan and Savings Bank. The sureties in both instances is The Bankers Deposite Guaranty & Surety Company of Topeka, Kansas.

Saturday, April 22 - 1922.

The board met in regular session. Commissioners Steele and Kretzinger present. Commissioner Cox absent owing to sickness. Commissioner and Chairman Robt. Steele presided.

Order of the State Tax Commission directing that the property owned by The Lloyd Beaton Post, American Legion, situate on High Street, Baldwin, be placed on the tax exempt list of Douglas County was, by motion duly made, seconded, and passed, adopted.

Order of the Board ordered cancellation of \$2.50 in total valuation of \$5.00. extended on the 1921 tax roll against Charles E. Canavan's Guardian, the remaining \$2.50 to be taxed and collected according to law. The reason for the cancellation was because the Deputy Assessor charged Canavan with the full 12 months for money invested in Government bonds, whereas matter of fact the bonds were not acquired until after Sept. 1, 1921.
