Tuesday, June 13, 1922.

The Board met in adjourned regular session, all the commissioners present, and Commissioner and Chairman Robt. A. Steele presiding.

The monthly reports of the County Farm and Home Superintendent and the Commissioner of the Poor were received, audited and approved.

By order of the State Tax Commission the Board ordered that lot 148 on Tennessee street, in the city of Lawrence, owned by the Gamma sigma sorority, stricken from the tax rolls, the property being exempt from taxation under the provisions of Section 11153, Laws of Kansas.

For the same reason, and also by direction of the State Tax Commission, the Board ordered lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, block 30, Quivera Place, and lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, block 31, Quivera Place, stricken from the tax rolls, said property being owned by the University of Kansas. In both the above cases the property is to remain exempt so long as it is used for the purposes indicated in the application and in the section above cited. Should it ever revert to private persons said properties are again to be placed on the tax rolls.
