Convening, the board met this date as a convening board to can-

Monday, August 7 - 1922.

The board met this date for the first day of the August
 session. Commissioners Stule, Kutsinger and Harford and the
 County Clerk were present. Commissioners and Chairman Stule
 presided.

By motion duly made, seconded and passed, the board by a vote of
 3 ayes and not any nays, adopted the following resolution, to-wit:

Order Commission of Tax Com-
 mission to make Special
 Tax Levy -

WHEREAS, the equalized value of the taxing district of Douglas
 County, Kansas is \$45,344,307.00 and this is the value to be used
 in making the levy against Douglas County in August of the year
 1922,

AND WHEREAS, the limit of levy on said valuation for the purpose
 of creating a general fund for the ensuing year is 1.16 mills
 which will raise the sum of \$52,367.16,

AND WHEREAS, The expenses to be charged against said general fund
 will exceed the amount to be raised by said levy together with
 the emergency warrants already authorized,

AND WHEREAS, the quarterly fees to be received will not bring
 said general fund above the expenses to be charged against it,

AND WHEREAS, said general fund will be overdrawn at the end of
 this fiscal year,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED By the Board of Commissioners of
 Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session this 7th day of August,
 1922, that an emergency tax of 25% of an 1.16 mills or .29 mills
 must be levied on \$45,344,307.00 for the general fund of this
