

The joint board, after due consideration of the subject matter, find that the special assessments on all the lots and tracts of ground within the city of Lawrence, Kansas, within the benefit district as delineated by the Board of Commissioners of the city of Lawrence, Kansas, are just, reasonable, equitable and fair, and should not be altered or changed, and it is therefore ordered by the joint board, composed of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Douglas, Kansas, and the Board of Commissioners of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, a majority of each of said boards concurring therein, that the special assessment apportioned to the lots and tracts of land within the benefit district created in connection with the improvement of N. 7th street from Locust street north to the north city limits in the City of Lawrence, Kansas, by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, be and the same are hereby affirmed, ratified and confirmed, and that said special assessments shall be collected in the manner provided by law.

It was further ordered that the action of said joint board above be recorded at length upon the records of the County Clerk of Douglas County, Kansas, at the City of Lawrence, Kansas.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and passed the joint board adjourned without day.

Immediately after adjournment of the joint board, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, Commissioners Steele, Kettinger and Hooper and the County Clerk were present. Commissioner Steele presided.

The following communication from the County attorney was presented to the board, read and filed, and incorporated in the minutes of the board meeting, to wit:

Order R. Board of County Commissioners Douglas County, Kansas.

Resolved: In regard to the suit filed by H. C. Ellis for the year 1920 on certain Liberty bonds owned by him, it has been recently held by the Supreme Court of this state that such a suit is illegal. Mr. Ellis' suit said suit under protest and would be successful in a suit against the County to recover his money, the statute of limitations not having run against said claim.
