The board met in adjourned regular session, Commissioner Stuk, Kistinger & Horsford & the County clerk being present, Commissioner & Chairman Stuk presided.

Order came. By motion duly made, seconded & passed, the board ordered a cancellation of taxes appearing on the 1922 tax roll against the 1922 lot A. T. & S. F. Ry. Co. in amount \$572.92, for the following reason. Against Error on the part of the Waukegan township board in making a sale to the State of 1.40 for general purposes when only .75 per acre can legally be levied.

By motion duly made, seconded & passed, the board authorized a cancellation of taxes appearing on the 1922 Tax roll against the A. T. & S. F. Ry. Co. in the City of Englewood, lots 7, 8, 9-10, 11, 12, block 1922-2d, 108, in amount \$6,541. Reason: Property is taxed by the City of Englewood & is included in the amount determined by that body.

By motion duly made, seconded & passed, the board authorized a cancellation of taxes appearing on the 1922 Tax roll on the following described property: One road on the S. side of road S. 50th & N. 110th in amount \$1.50, for the following reason: The road above described is now being used as a public road. Claims against the county were presented, audited and allowed, for which see 1922 Allowance Record.
