

Monday, January 8, 1923.

The board met in adjourned regular session, Ben Harrison, Stude, Kulings and Hopford are the County Clerk present. Commissioners and Chairman Stude present.

The resignation of Chas. J. Richards, State Justice of the Peace of Endon Township, was received. Mr. Richards, having posted his bond and duly qualified, the resignation, by motion duly made, seconded and passed, was accepted.

The order of the State Tax Commissioner, placing on the Tax exempt list of Douglas county lot 1, block 37, Quinlan Place, City of Lawrence, and ordering that a refunding warrant be issued in reimbursement of the first half of 1922 tax, was received. And upon motion duly made, seconded and passed, the clerk was directed to comply with the above order.

By motion duly made, seconded and passed, the clerk was directed to issue and forward to the Secretary of the County Commissioners a warrant for \$5.00, in payment of annual dues for the Douglas County board of County Commissioners.

The board entered into contract with Malt & Young to paint about the Douglas County Court House, as follows: First -

Lawrence, Kansas, January 6 - 1923 -
Contract for painting to be done on Douglas County Court House -
Submitted as follows:

We, the undersigned, agree to resurface three sets of oak doors, which have been damaged by decay and to refinish two coats of Saloper varnish, for the consideration of \$45.00.

Flag pole on Court house to be painted with composition white, for the consideration of \$25.00.

All window sills on first & second floors (61 in number) to be thoroughly cleaned and filled where necessary, and given one coat of shellac and one coat of Saloper varnish, for the consideration of \$25.00. Total for all, \$95.00.

All work to be done in first-class workmanship manner and all materials to be of standard grade.
