

Tuesday February 20-1923

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The board in Special Session unanimously passed the following resolution —

Be It Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, in special session this 20th day of February 1923, that ^{Charles} ^{Underwood} defendant in the case of the state of Kansas vs Charlie Underwood has served confinement imposed in said case. And whereas said Charlie Underwood has not sufficient funds with which to pay the fine & costs, and the commissioners have no work for him to do, That upon the said Charlie Underwood paying the costs of the above action named, and signing the agreement hereto attached the Sheriff of Douglas County is hereby authorized to release said Charlie Underwood from confinement in the Douglas County Jail.
