Lawrence, Kansas, March 12-1923

To the Board of County Commissioners,

Douglas County, Kansas.

Gentlemen: - The County Advisory Board of the Salvation Army in Douglas Co. Kansas, hereby applies for exemption from all future taxation on the property located at 729 Vermont St., the legal description of same being Lot number 37 on Vermont Street in the original town of Lawrence.

The reason for the foregoing request is that this property was transferred from F. M. Holliday and W. A. Jolly by warranty deed to "The Salvation Army (Incorporated)" on Nov. 7-1922 was entered in the office of the Register of Deeds of Douglas County on Dec. 30-1922, and that the building located on said lot 37 Vermont, is known as the "Salvation Army Citadel", and is and will be used as long as the Army owns the property for religious and charitable purposes only.
