

In the matter of exemption of property belonging to Eta Chapter of Delta Zeta Fraternity, Baldwin, Kansas, the following resolution was passed unanimously by the board

Resolution.

Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, State of Kansas, in special session, this 21st day of April 1923, that whereas, the property described as lots 98, 99 and 100 on Dearborn Street, Baldwin, are owned by the Eta Chapter of the Delta Zeta Fraternity, and lots 96 and 97 are controlled by the same Fraternity as shown by the attached affidavit and whereas said property is entitled to exemption from taxation under section 11151 General Statutes of Kansas of 1915. Therefore

We, the said Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, recommend to the State Tax Commission, that the above described property be exempt from taxation, and that the County Clerk of Douglas County, Kansas, be instructed to mark "Exempt" following the description of the above described property on the assessment rolls and tax rolls of Douglas County

Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas Co. Kansas, in special session this 21st day of April 1923, that whereas one Ed. Deck has served the sentence imposed upon him in the case of State of Kansas vs. Ed. Deck, and has no funds with which to pay the fine herein imposed and
