

2. We do not believe that the proposed changes will materially; if at all, increase the number of people served, or the amount of service rendered.
3. That the said road since its designation and location has been well and properly maintained.
4. No other community in Douglas County has shown greater appreciation or taken more interest in its County Road than that of Lone Star.

The above assertion is verified by the fact that in the past three years, seven "Good Roads" days have been designated, and in those seven days alone over three hundred and fifty (350) days work were donated, much of which was done on the above mentioned road.
