is now valued on the Assessment Rolls of Douglas
 County at \$14,600, and that,

Whereas a large portion of this land has been in-
 undated and is continually under water, and no
 revenue can be obtained from this land by ag-
 riculture,

We recommend that this land be reduced in val-
 uation \$1,750, making the new valuation on the land
 only \$12,850, and that the County Clerk be instructed
 to make such reduction on the Assessment Rolls
 and Tax Rolls of Douglas County.
