For the reason that the bond issue of said district having been paid in full, no further funds are needed in the Int. & Sink. Fund of said district.

School District No. 38, having a balance in the Int. & Sink. Fund of \$81.94, and School District No. 87, having a balance in the Int. & Sink. Fund of \$101.09, and both districts having had bond issues and both having paid out; you are hereby ordered to transfer these amounts to the General Funds of said districts the same as in District No. 65, named above. All future credit to these Int. & Sink. Funds to be credited to the General Funds of said districts.

The coal bids for the coal for the Court House, Jail and County Farm, were opened and read by the County Clerk. The Commissioners decided the bids were too high and ordered them all rejected, instructing the County Clerk to re-advertise for coal for the present needs only.

A motion by Horsford and seconded by Steele to make the levy for the County Farm Bureau .045, which will raise \$2,045.50, was carried by the votes of Steele and Horsford, Kretzinger voting "No."

By a unanimous vote the Board decided to offer a reward of \$200 for the arrest and conviction of the murderer of Roy McNight, colored, who was murdered in the alley near the old Dante Hotel the night of Aug 11, 1923.

By a unanimous vote of the Board in the matter of transferring money from Drainage District No 4 to Maple Grove Drainage District, the order was reconsidered and the County Clerk was instructed to issue the following order:

To W. H. McKone, County Treasurer.

In the matter of transferring money from Drainage District No. 4 to the Maple Grove District, you are hereby instructed not to make such transfer because of recent action in Drainage District No. 4.

Read - 15th Page 51: The following order was given the County Clerk to be transmitted to the Treasurer at the regular meeting of the Commissioners on Aug. 15th, and is here inserted because it has been omitted in the minutes of that date. Mr. Richards of Eudora appeared before the Board and called their attention to the fact that Lot 8, Block 238 in the City of Eudora, was on the Tax roll at a valuation of \$40, and that since this lot is a part of the public road, it should not appear upon the tax roll.
