The Board of County Commissioners continued in session with all present. Dec. 8th 1923

Bills were allowed and a hedge notice sent to Mrs. Sarah H. Shearer to cut the hedge along the west side of north-west quarter of section 11, Township 13, Range 19.

It was ordered that the County Clerk instruct the County Treasurer to cancel the personal property tax of Mrs. M. E. Lowin - same being an erroneous assessment - having no piano, and no exemption having been allowed. Amt. \$7.67. Order number 17.

Also order number 18 to cancel the tax on the personal property of Mrs. Lou Clark Blanner, because of erroneous assessment, Valuation 1905. Tax \$58.48.

Also to cancel the tax on personal property of Louella Sheriff, because exemption was not allowed. #15.

Valuation \$150.00 Tax \$4.60

Resolution -

Lawrence, Kansas -

Dec. 5th 1923.

Whereas, The Midland Trail between Kansas City, Missouri, and Lawrence, Kansas, passing through Rosedale, now a part of Kansas City, Kansas, Merriam, Shawnee, Garah, North-Elto, Cedar Junction, and DeSoto, in Johnson County, and through Eudora and Lawrence in Douglas County, is one of the oldest, most important and most heavily used of the Inter-state highways within the State of Kansas, and,

Whereas, The Midland Trail, as a federal aid primary Highway, has been already paved with concrete between Lawrence and Topeka; and,

Whereas, The Midland Trail, between Kansas City, Missouri and Lawrence, should be designated at the present time as a primary federal aid highway of the State of Kansas because of its importance, and in order that the largest possible amount of federal aid apportionment

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
