

Monday June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1924.

The Board of County Commissioners met for the first meeting of the June session. Present - Hooford & Steele & Kretzinger, and county clerk. Claims against the county were presented, audited and allowed as per the warrant record.

On account of the illness of Mrs. Kuhne, deputy county, the county clerk appointed E. L. Bussing, deputy county clerk. Appointment was approved by the commissioners. Commissioner Kretzinger was absent on account of the death of his sister. Road petition signed by R. E. Melcher & others for the relocation of certain road described as follows, town: - Beg. at a point 276 feet west of the N.E. corner of the S.E. quarter of sec. 12, township 14 range 18; turns in a southwesterly direction to the private road that turns into the B.H. Powell home, thence south to and ending at 20 feet East of a large corner post on the south line of said B.H. Powell farm. Length of said road is about 120 rods. Was presented. The board named C.B. Hooford, Robt Steele and G.C. Kretzinger as viewers to view said road at 10 A.M. Saturday June 21<sup>st</sup> 1924.

Wednesday June 4<sup>th</sup>

The Board met at 10 A.M. and viewers on the road petitioned for by Simon L. Cotton for vacation with C.B. Hooford, Robt Steele and G.C. Kretzinger present.

In the afternoon at the Court House with C.B. Hooford, Robt Steele & E.C. Bussing present, bills were allowed as per the allowance register.

The application of Orilla Lawson for a mother's pension was received and referred to Mrs. Kennedy for investigation, and arrangements were made to pay Mrs. Lawson Ten dollars a month from the poor Fund temporarily.

In the matter of the Road Petition presented by Leonard Lee & others, the Board instructed the County Clerk to inform Mr. Lee that at the present time the County is maintaining its full quota of miles of road, and that it is impossible for them to take on any more at this time.
