Resolution.

Be it Resolved, By the Board of County Commissioners, of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session this 7th day of June 1924, that whereas the following described property, to wit:

Beginning at a point on the East line of Ohio Street in the City of Lawrence, Kansas, 187 feet north of the South line of the South-west quarter (4) of Section 31, Township 12 - Range 20, thence South 75 feet, thence East 90 feet, thence north 75 feet, thence west 90 feet to point of beginning, all in the City of Lawrence, Douglas Co. Ks. is the property of the Pi Epsilon Fraternity Corporation, and that said property is exempt from taxation under Section 70-303 of the Revised Statutes of Kansas for 1923.

Therefore, we, the said Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, recommend to the State Tax Commission that the above described property be exempt from taxation, and that the County Clerk of Douglas County, Kansas be instructed to mark the exemption of the above described property on the assessment rolls, and the tax rolls of Douglas County, Kansas.
