

Monday July 7-1924

The Board of County Commissioners met in the first meeting of the July session. Present Hosford, Steele, Kretzinger & County Clerk.

Claims against the county were presented audited and allowed as per the allowance record.

A protest from Baker University, relatively to improving the West road from Law to Baldwin was read and filed.

The monthly reports of C. D. Siger, Supt. of Co. Farm, Mrs. Emma Kennedy, Com. of Poor and E. P. Keith, Health Officer, also the following quarterly reports were approved.

- Petition of Earl Davis - Prisoner in County Jail - To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners.

Your petitioner, Earl Davis, ^{states} that on or about June 5, 1924, he was sentenced, in the Justice Court of John W. Clark, to serve thirty days in the County Jail and pay a fine of \$100.00 and cost of the action, on a charge having liquor in his possession; he further states he has served the 30 days in jail, and that he can raise the money to pay the costs in the case, but that he has been unable to procure the money to pay the said fine of \$100.00.

Wherefore, your petitioner prays that your honorable body remit the fine so imposed upon him upon the payment by him of the costs assessed against him in the case, so that he may be released and go to work in the harvest fields to support his wife.
