That all of the above described road is a part of the present county road system of Douglas County, Kansas, duly constituted as such by law; that the improvement by grading, draining, and surfacing of said road with dirt or other natural material on site for a width of twenty eight feet, and building of all necessary bridges and culverts, all in accordance with the plans, specifications and estimates, approved by the State Highway Engineer and the United States Secretary of Agriculture, is an immediate necessity and is of general public utility.

Vacate, Beginning at the S. E. cor. of N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$, sec. 33 T. 12 S., R. 18 E. - Thence west on or near $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. line, about one mile, and ending at the S. W. cor. of the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$, sec. 33 - T. 12 S. - R. 18 E.

Re-locate, - Beginning at the S. W. cor. of N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$, sec. 33 - T. 12 S. - R. 18 E., thence north on $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. line, about one half mile and ending at the N. W. cor. of N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ - sec. 33 - T. 12 S. - R. 18 E. - which point is in the Still and terminating at County Road.
