The following opinion was handed to the Board by the County Attorney concerning the purchase of a building for road machinery. To the Board of County Commissioners, Douglas County, Kansas.

Gentlemen: Regarding the purchase of a site with building thereon for the purpose of housing County Road equipment and machinery, it is the opinion of this office that under the General Powers granted to the Board of County Commissioners under the laws of this State that the Board may purchase said site with building thereon without submitting the same to the voters at an election.

The following contract was presented to the Board - Whereas, the County of Douglas, State of Kansas, is the owner of an electric transmission line extending from the corner of Bishop and Barker Avenues in the City of Lawrence, Kansas, to the premises known as the "County Farm" in said County, over which said transmission line electric current is being supplied for use on said "County Farm" by The Kansas Electric Power Company (successors to The Lawrence Railway and Light Company) under a contract between the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, and The Lawrence Railway and Light Company, bearing date December 21, 1911; and

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County is desirous of being relieved of the expense of the maintenance of said line and of all liability in connection with the operation thereof, and The Kansas Electric Power Company is willing to take over the maintenance and operation of said line on condition that the title thereto be transferred to it and that it shall have the contract for the furnishing of electric energy to said County Farm for the term and period and upon the conditions hereinafter set out.
