

Monday, January 5th 1925

The Board of County Commissioners met in the first meeting of the January session. Present Commissioners Steele and Kretzinger. Claims against the County were presented and allowed as per the allowance record.

In the matter of the resignation of Mr. C. B. Hosford the following resolutions were passed by the Board, consisting of Commissioners Robert Steele, Commissioner G. E. Kretzinger and County Clerk O. B. Bussing.

Whereas, Mr. C. B. Hosford, Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners has been appointed Post Master of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, and

Whereas, Mr. Hosford has tendered his resignation to the Board of County Commissioners at their meeting December 27th 1924, and his resignation has been accepted by the said Board, and

Whereas, Mr. Hosford has been a conscientious and efficient County Officer serving the people of Douglas County in a fair and unbiased manner at all times, always doing what he has believed to be fair and just with all parties, and

Whereas, he has been an agreeable co-worker and it has always been a pleasure to work with him.

Now therefore, Be it resolved our regret that it has become necessary for him to sever his connection with the Board and we wish him the fullest measure of success in his new undertaking.

Mr. Bussing presented the bond of Mr. Kennedy to the board and administered the oath of office which at once took up the duties of his office. Bills were allowed as per the allowance record.
