

Monday - Jan 12 - 1925 -

The Board met in adjourned regular session. Present commissioners G. E. Kesting, K. J. Kennedy and Robert Steele and County Clerk E. C. Bussing. The forenoon was spent in checking over the ~~annual~~ ^{quarterly} reports of the various townships.

At twelve o'clock noon D. L. Burton was sworn in as County Commissioner of the Third District to take the place of Robert Steele, whose term expired at this time. At one o'clock P.M. the County Clerk called the Board to order and proceeded with the re-organization. Mr. Kesting was chosen chairman and took the chairmans place at the head of the table. Mr. Kennedy was then chosen as vice chairman, and the following appointments were made by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Journal-World was named as the official County paper. The following appointments were approved by the Board: Joe Hellman, Deputy Register of Deeds; Dr. E. L. Bussing, Deputy County Clerk; Mrs. D. F. Smith, Deputy Clerk of the Court; Robert Rutherford, Undersheriff; George Price, Deputy Sheriff; F. W. Kingsbury, Bailiff of the Court.
