

Monday February 2nd 1925

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in the first session of the February session. Present chairman G. E. Kretzinger, commissioners V. J. Kennedy and D. L. Burton, and County Clerk E. C. Bussing.

Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per the allowance record.

The Board order a refund for the Pi Deuteron Chapter of the Phi Gamma Delta for tax for 1924. Valuation \$1800⁰⁰ Tax \$56⁴³ for the reason that their old property had been placed on the tax roll for 1924. The annual reports from Palmyra and Eudora twps. were approved by the Board.

The Board planned for chairman Kretzinger to go to Topeka and talk over the proposition to open a road in the North western corner of the county. Mr. Kretzinger went to Topeka Tuesday and talked with the Shawnee commissioners and arrangements were made to have the two boards meet at the point of beginning of the road petitioned for in sec 35-11-17. The Board adjourned to meet Wednesday Feb 4-1925.

Wednesday February 4th 1925

The Board met in adjourned regular session. Present Kretzinger, Kennedy and Burton and County Clerk Bussing. Bills against the county were presented and allowed as per the allowance. The Board cancelled all warrants against the county three years old that had not been collected and instructed the county clerk to file all cancelled warrants. Total cancelled at this time amounting to \$221.¹³
