The Public Service Commission believes that on the showing made in the application it is justified to exercise the power given it under R. S. 79-1924, in allowing an emergency increase of 25 per cent. The maximum general levy allowed on said valuation in said county, for the year 1925, according to R. S. 79-1924, is 1.17 mills per dollar. Adding 25 per cent to this levy gives a rate of 1.4625 mills, which applied to the tangible value will raise in revenue \$65,411.56.

It is therefore, by the Public Service Commission, on this 22^d, day of August, 1925.

Ordered, That the board of county commissioners of Douglas county, may for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1925, make a rate of levy against the tangible valuation in said county, amounting to 44,725,853 of 1.4625 mills. It is the purpose of this order to allow an emergency levy of .2925 mills in addition to the regular levy of 1.17 mills.

The secretary will transmit a certified copy of this order to the county clerk of said county.

By the commission it is so ordered.
