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The Board of County Commissioners, consisting of the following persons: X.J.Kennedy, D.L.Burton and G.E.Kretsinger met in the capacity of a Board of Equalization to listen to the complaints of persons feeling themselves aggrieved on the assessments made upon their properties in the year 1926, said assessment to continue for four years. The different assessing districts were heard in . the following manner:

The Board of Equalization was in constant session for ten days, not including Sunday, adjourning each evening to return again the next morning. At the end of the ten-day period, May 27, they adjourned and reviewed the complaints before them. They instructed the County Clerk to notify all persons whose property values had been raised.

The Board met again on June eighth, continuing in session June 8, 9 & 10th to hear complaints from those parties whom the County Clerk had notified of a raise in valuation.

All changes in the valuation of real estate throughout the County as made by the Board of Equalization is shown by the red ink figures in the proper columns of the assessment rolls. All changes made in personal property is shown by describing such changes on the personal property statements on file in the County Clerk's office.

Owing to the fact that some parties failed to obtain a hearing during the first ten days' session of the Board of Equalization the Board instructed the County Clerk to write to the Public Service Commission for permission to continue in session for a longer period of time. The County Clerk wrote such request to the Public Service Commission and received the following order:
