

IN THE MATTER OF RECONVENING THE COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION
OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS FOR THE YEAR 1926.

O R D E R

It has been made to appear to the Public Service Commission that on account of the unusual number of protests against real estate valuations in Douglas County for assessment purposes, said County Board of Equalization cannot, in the regularly allotted time of ten days provided by the fifth paragraph of R.S. 79-1602, finish its equalization work. The said board has, therefore, requested this commission to reconvene it upon its adjournment after its ten days' session as by law provided, for the purpose of completing the work of equalization, for such length of time as these duties require. The commission is of the opinion that the circumstances in Douglas County warrant this commission in granting the county board's request.

It is, therefore, on this 25th day of May, 1926, by the Public Service Commission,

ORDERED, That the board of county commissioners of Douglas County reconvene as a county board of equalization immediately upon its adjournment from its ten days' statutory session for such length of time as will be necessary to enable it to complete the work of equalization of property between the various taxpayers of the County, provided, however, that said board must adjourn this special session on or before such date as will permit it to complete its work of equalization and adjourn sine die on or before the 20th day of June, 1926, as by law made and provided.

At said adjourned session of said county board, it shall be privileged to perform all or any of the duties, which it is allowed to perform during the regular statutory ten day session, and the taxpayers affected in said adjourned session shall be given the same notice that is required by the law of the county board during the regular ten day equalization period.

By the Commission it is so ordered.
