

Monday August 2 - 1926

The Board met in the first meeting of the August session. Present K. J. Kennedy, D. L. Burton & J. E. Kretzinger and the County Clerk E. C. Bussing. Claims against the County were presented and allowed as per the allowance record. The City of Lawrence presented an application to have the following described lots exempted from taxation, for the reason they are owned and used by the City of Lawrence. Description (South half lot 65 and all of lots 67, 69 and 71. Block 14, West Lawrence.)

The Com. passed by unanimous vote a resolution recommending to the State Tax Com. that the above described lots be exempted from taxation.

The Board met in adjourned regular session. Present K. J. Kennedy, D. L. Burton & J. E. Kretzinger & County Clerk. Claims against the County were presented and allowed as per the allowance record.

At 10 A.M. the hour set for protests on the Proposed Improvement on the Golden Belt in Grant Township there being no one present to protest the Board passed the final resolution for the surfacing of said road. Resolution follows. -

Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, that the section of county road described as follows, to-wit - Beginning at a point on the County road, designated by the State Highway Com. as a proposed Federal Aid Road said point being near the quarter corner of the North line of sec. 2: T. 12 S. R. 19 E. which point is on the Jefferson Douglas County line and extending thence along said road in a southeasterly direction to the center quarter corner of sec. 7: T. 12 S. R. 20 E. thence south to the quarter corner on the south line of sec. 19: T. 12 S. R. 20 E. which point is on the north City limits of City of Lawrence a distance of 5 miles more or less, to the point of ending, as initiated by the order and resolution passed by the Board June 10, 1925; be improved as a Federal Aid Road and that the construction and maintenance work be carried out under the direct supervision of the State Highway Com. acting as agent for said county, as required in the Federal Aid Road Act and as authorized in Chapter 264 of the Session Laws Kans. of 1917.
