

and amendments thereto subject to the inspection and approval of the Sec. of Agriculture and in accordance with the rules and regulations adopted by the Secretary. This action of the Board of County Com. being in accordance with the decision of the State Highway Com. to recommend Federal Aid to the amount of fifty (50%) percent of the entire cost, not to exceed \$15,000.00 per mile not including the cost of surveys, preparing plans, specifications and estimates prior to the beginning of construction work or the cost of new right of way. Further resolved, that the cost of all inspection required on the work, and of any resident engineers deemed necessary by the State Highway Com. shall be made a charge against the improvement, but shall be paid monthly, by the County as the work progresses. This action of the County Board being with the understanding that the cost of the engineering supervision given the work by the regular force of the State Highway Com. will be paid by the State and that the inspection and any resident engineers used on the work will be selected by work under the direct supervision of the State Highway Com. Further Resolved, that this Board pledges the good faith of said Douglas Co. Kansas, to construct this improvement and maintain said road as required in Federal Aid Road Act and the laws of Kansas.
