The following application was presented and resolution passed. To the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas - Gentlemen - The Board of Education of the Northern Baptist Convention has purchased the residence property at 1124 Miss. St. Lawrence. The deed describes the property as the North Half (50 feet) of Lot Number Nine (9) in Block Number Nine (9) in Quast Add. an Addition to the City of Law. This property has been purchased for use as a parsonage. Rev. C. H. Thomas and his family have already moved in. Mr. Thomas is the Baptist University Pastor, devoting his time to religious work among the Baptist students at the University and Haskell Institute and assisting in the work of the first Baptist Church of Lawrence. Understanding that property which is used as a parsonage may be exempted from regular taxation, I hereby make application for exemption for this property. John F. Watts.
