construction of Federal Aid Road work in Douglas County, Kansas said road work known as State Highway No. 10 Road, Section 8. Project 229, will be received at the office of the County Clerk, Lawrence, Kans. untill 11 o'clock A.M. September 28th, 1926 and then publicly opened. Said proposed improvements includes the construction of an 18 ft. wide Concrete, Brick or Bituminous road with 5 foot wide earth shoulders, together with all work involved and indicated by the plans and specifications herewith. The net length of road to be constructed is 4.997 miles, and is briefly described as beginning at a point at the north City limits of Lawrence, thence in a northerly direction, then in a north westerly direction to a point of ending on the Douglas-Jefferson County line, in Sec. 2 Twp. 12 S., R. 19 E. Proposals must be accompanied by a certified check for five (5) percent of the bid made payable to the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners as a guarantee that if awarded the contract, the bidder will enter into contract and give bond as required. Detailed information of the work to be done may be had by an examination of the plans and specifications on file in the office of the County Clerk and County Engineer. The Board of County Commissioners reserves the right to reject any and all proposals and to waive technicalities. By order of the Board of County Commissioners. E. C. At eleven o'clock the County Board adjourned to the Court Room, the better to accommodate the crowd of bidders & material men, and then proceed to open the bids on the above described work.
