

April 4, 1927.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of April with D.L. Burton, Chairman, J.F. Kennedy, G.E. Kretzinger and County Clerk, C.O. Bowman present. The minutes of the regular session of March 7, as well as, the minutes of the adjourned regular sessions of March 9th, 12th and 16th were read and approved. Monthly claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Record.

April 6, 1927

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with D.L. Burton, Chairman, J.F. Kennedy, G.E. Kretzinger and County Clerk, C.O. Bowman present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Record. This being the day for opening the bids on the excavation of the drainage ditch as advertised in the Lawrence Daily Journal-World March 15, 1927, and the hour of 11 o'clock having arrived the Board publicly opened all such bids and awarded the contract to Lister Heathley of Kansas City, Mo. at 23¢ per cu. yd and a total cost of 1962²⁵, this being the lowest bid.

This being the day and hour for opening the bids for Guardrail & Cable fittings as advertised in the Lawrence Daily Journal-World March 15, 1927, the Board publicly opened these bids, and awarded the contract to The Carter-Waters Corporation of Kansas City, Mo. at a contract price of One thousand two hundred ten & ²²/₁₀₀ Dollars (\$1210²²).

The following resignation was presented to the Board. To the Board of County Commissioners: - I hereby tender my resignation as Treasurer of Marion Township, signed: W.H. Ulrich. Moved by J.F. Kennedy and seconded by G.E. Kretzinger that the resignation of W.H. Ulrich as Treasurer of Marion Township be accepted. Carried. Moved by J.F. Kennedy and seconded by G.E. Kretzinger that Franklin E. Lutz be appointed trustee of Marion Township to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of W.H. Ulrich. Carried.

The Citizens Light, Heat and Power Company and also Peoples Utilities Kansas Corporation appeared before the Board of County Commissioners this 6th day of April 1927 by Ord Cellingman, their attorney, and presented to the Board an assignment of the contract entered into on the 23rd day of December, 1916, by and between the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, and the Citizens Light, Heat and Power Company to Peoples Utilities Kansas Corporation, which assignment is executed and dated on the 17th day of January, 1927.
