The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of November with D. L. Burton, Chairman, J. Kennedy & G. E. Kretzinger, Commissioners, and C. Bowman, County Clerk present. The minutes of the regular session October 3, and the adjourned regular sessions of October 5th, 8th, and the 11th were read and approved. Monthly claims against the County were presented and allowed as per allowance register.

On motion duly made and seconded a refund warrant in the amount of Six dollars & 35/100 cents was ordered drawn in favor of Mrs. M. J. Hamilton, on account of erroneous assessment of personal property, it being found the the deputy assessor did not allow the constitutional exemption.

The Board of Review of the J. M. Harrison road recommended that the road be located on the line of the old road or as near as the County Engineer found it economically to so locate it. On motion of J. Kennedy, seconded by G. E. Kretzinger the recommendations were unanimously approved.

The Board of County Commissioners ordered the County Clerk to instruct the County Treasurer to cancel fees and interest charged on Tax Sale No. 425 of the 1926 Tax Sale, amounting to 46 cents.

November 9, 1927.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with D. L. Burton, Chairman, Commissioners J. Kennedy, and G. E. Kretzinger and C. Bowman, County Clerk, present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per allowance register. The Board ordered the County Clerk to instruct the County Treasurer to cancel personal Property tax amounting to Three ⁴⁴/₁₀₀ Dollars assessed against Mrs. Eva H. Hunsinger for the reason that Mrs. Hunsinger was not credited with her \$200⁰⁰ Constitutional exemption. Also the fees and interest on sale No 26 for the 1926.

On motion of G. E. Kretzinger seconded by Commissioner J. J. Kennedy the following resolution was unanimously adopted.
