RESOLUTION

Proposed Road Improvement in Wakarusa Township

Whereas a petition signed by more than fifty-one per cent of the resident landowners owning at least thirty-five per cent of the land, or being more than thirty-five per cent of the resident landowners, owning at least fifty-one per cent of the land, or being the owners of at least sixty per cent of the land in the proposed benefit district, has been filed with the County Clerk of Douglas County, Kansas, praying for the permanent improvement of a certain road in Douglas County, Kansas, known as the Lakeview County Road, and specifically described in the petition set out above, and, Whereas the boundaries of said proposed Benefit District are set out specifically and fully in said petition, and the petition being in due and regular form:

Be it Resolved: That the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session this fifth day of January, 1928, declare the road described in said petition to be of public utility, and that said road be permanently improved, and that a final hearing on said petition be had on the eleventh day of February, 1928.

The Fourth Quarterly Reports of the Register of Deeds, Clerk of the District Court and the Probate Judge, were approved by the Board of County Commissioners and ordered filed.

On motion by X. J. Kennedy, seconded by G. E. Kretsinger, it was unanimously voted to buy Indemnity Insurance to protect the County under the Workmans Compensation Act as amended by the Laws of 1927.

January 7, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with D. L. Burton, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and G. E. Kretsinger, Commissioners, and County Clerk, C. O. Bowman, present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register.

The report of the County Clerk for the Fourth Quarter, 1927, was approved by the Board, as were the reports of the Superintendent of the County Farm, and the report of the Commissioner of the Poor, for the month of December, 1927.

On motion properly made and seconded the Board of County Commissioners ordered a refund warrant in the amount of \$35.30 drawn in favor of Glenn Dickenson on account of an erroneous assessment of \$1000 placed on Lot "20" Mass. St., Lawrence, Kansas, as added improvements for the assessing period of 1927; and, also ordered the assessment stricken from the rolls.

Wm. Huff of Baldwin City, was granted a refund of \$8.58 on personal tax for the year 1927, on account of no exemption being given on the assessment of personal property. Smith Leonard of Baldwin City was granted a refund of \$15.00 on his intangible assessment of 1927 because of double assessment. Hattie Hackett of Baldwin City was granted a refund of \$ on Lot No. Chappel St., Baldwin, Kans. on account of the improvements being removed therefrom after March 1, 1926, and before March 1, 1927, but not reported by the deputy assessor for the taxing year of 1927. Value of improvements removed, \$ Rate of Taxation, 42.92

January 11, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with D. L. Burton, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and G. E. Kretsinger, Commissioners, and County Clerk, C. O. Bowman, present. The Board finished their work of allowing claims against the county as per Allowance Register.

A Benefit District Petition for Road Improvement for the improvement of US 50, from Baldwin City west to the intersection with US 73W. was filed with the County Clerk, and presented to the Board, who instructed the County Engineer to confer with the State Highway Commission as to Federal and State Aid and to the location of the road.

A Road Petition signed by John V. Fritzel and eleven others, petitioning for the widening to 40 feet in Douglas County, described as follows: Beginning at the N.W. Cor. of the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of sec. 12 - 13 - 19: thence south one-half mile to the S.W. Cor. of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Sec 12 - 13 - 19. This petition being for the purpose of widening the present 28 foot road to a 40 foot road, 6 feet of land to be taken from both sides of the road.

The petition being in due and regular form, the Board of County Commissioners, on motion properly made and carried, appointed themselves viewers and fixed, February 15, 1928, at 1:30 o'clock p.m. and the place of beginning of said petitioned road, as the time and place of hearing on said petition.

A petition signed by D. F. Smith and eleven others, petitioning for the location of a road: Beginning at the Northwest corner of the south half of the SW 1/4 sec. 36 Twp 13, R 18 in Clinton Township, Douglas County, Kansas, and running north 80 rods more or less intersecting with the public highway, was filed in the office of County Clerk, and the Board of County Commissioners finding the petition to be regular, the Board appointed themselves viewers of said petitioned road and fixed February 15, 1928, at 3:30 o'clock P. M. and the place of beginning of said petitioned road as the time and place of hearing on said petition.

On motion properly made and seconded, The Lawrence Daily Journal-World was designated as the official paper of the County for the year of 1928.

This being the first regular session of the Board of County Commissioners for the year 1928, and being the last meeting of the regular session for the month of January, the Board organized for the year by electing Commissioner G. E. Kretsinger as Chairman, and X. J. Kennedy as vice Chairman for the year 1928
