

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD M

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March 5, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of March, With G. E. Kretsinger, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and D. L. Burton, Commissioners, and County Clerk, C. O. Bowman, present. The minutes of the meetings of the regular session for the month of February, held on February 6, 8, 11, 15, were read and approved by the Board. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register. The Board received and adopted the report of the Viewers on the petition of John Fratzle and others, for the widening of a certain road in Wakarusa Township, which report recommended that the prayer of the petition be granted as to widening said road, but that the additional twelve feet to be added to the road be taken from the land adjoining said road on the east.

John Fratzle Road

March 7, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members of the Board and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register. The claim of the Wellsville Rural High School against Douglas County for tuition of pupils from this county was not allowed, for the reason that the County Attorney ruled that the law providing for the payment of High School tuition does not provide for a semi-annual distribution of the Special High School fund. The petition of Josie Lee McGee for Mothers Aid was presented to the Board. The prayer of the petition was not allowed. A petition of C. E. Peterson and others for a road called the "Emery Road and West Hills Parking" was presented to the Board. The petition was referred to the County Attorney.

Payment of Paul High School Tuition

March 10, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members of the Board and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per allowance register. The appeal of George Sullivan from a decision of the County Superintendent in the matter of change of school district boundary lines as between school districts Nos. 32 and 18, Douglas County, Kansas, was granted and the Board ordered that the west $\frac{1}{2}$ of section 24, and the west of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 24, T14S, R17E, be retained in and a part of School District No. 32. The following resolution was adopted by the Board of County Commissioners:

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session assembled this 10th day of March, 1928, that the amount of security to be required of the banks located in Douglas County, to secure county deposits in said banks shall be of the following kinds: Approved Surety Bonds, U. S. Government Bonds, or Kansas Municipal Bonds, and in the following amounts for all the months of the year, except for the months of June and December: Lawrence National Bank, \$25,000; Merchants National Bank, \$25,000; Watkins National Bank, \$25,000; Peoples State Bank, Lawrence, \$12,500; Kaw Valley State Bank, Eudora, \$10,000; Baldwin State Bank, Baldwin, \$10,000; Peoples State Bank, Baldwin, \$7,500; State Bank of Leocompton, \$7,500; Lone Star State Bank, Lone Star, \$5,000; and, for the months of June and December, the amount of security required of any one of the banks shall be double the amount required of said bank for the major part of the year.
