Regular
Session

November 4, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of november with G. E. Kretsinger, chairman, X. J. Kennedy and D. L. Burton, Commissioners, and C. O. Bowman, County Clerk, present. The minutes of the Board's meetings held on Oct. 1, 3, 6, and 10 were read and approved. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per Allowance Register.

November 7, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per allowance record.

The application of A. F. McClanahan for cancellation of the taxes for the year 1867 against lot 16, block 15, Babcocks Addition, was, on recommendation of County Attorney Melvin, allowed and the County Clerk was directed to order the County Treasurer to cancel said tax.

November 10, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in adjourned regular session and allowed claims as per allowance register. The County Clerk was authorized to issue the warrants of the county in payment of election judges and clerks serving at the General Election held Nov. 6, 1928, as shown by the poll books of the several voting precincts.

November 14, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk met in adjourned regular session. No other business except the allowing of claims was transacted.

November 24, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners met in special session with all members and the County Clerk present. A petition signed by Bert C. Jewett and five others contesting the election of Ed Johnson to the office of Trustee of Wakarusa Township at the general election held Nov. 6, 1928. The Board of County Commissioners after considering the petition and on advice of the County Attorney set December 12, 1928, as the date for determining such contest.

Regular
Session

December 3, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session for the month of December with G. E. Kretsinger, Chairman, X. J. Kennedy and D. L. Burton, Commissioners, and C. O. Bowman, County Clerk, present.

The minutes of the regular sessions held November 5, 7, 10, and 14; and the minutes of the meetings of the County Commissioners as a canvassing board held on November 9 and 13, were read and approved.

Monthly claims against the county were presented and allowed as per allowance register.

The County Treasurer was ordered to cancel \$19.30 intangible tax assessed against R. S. Fox, 1800 Miss. St., Lawrence, it being erroneously assessed.

The County Clerk was authorized, by motion properly made and carried, to correct errors and erroneous assessments on the 1928 tax rolls.

December 5, 1928

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were presented and allowed as per allowance register.

Resolution requesting an addition to the county system of public highways in Douglas County:

To the State Highway Commission:

WHEREAS:- Douglas County, Kansas, has all its present county road system, consisting of one hundred twenty-three miles, exclusive of State and Federal highways, heavy graded to a twentyeight foot crown, and fiftyfive per cent of the total mileage cast to an established grade;

AND WHEREAS:- Said Douglas County is equipped to handle more miles of highway in its county system;

AND WHEREAS:- Douglas County is entitled to more miles in its County System, since the separation of the State and Federal Highways from the County Highways;

And whereas:- There is now on file with the Douglas County Commissioners a petition signed by thirtythree landholders of Douglas County for the addition of the following township road to the County System of highways;

THEREFORE:- we do hereby respectfully petition your honorable body to grant the following described road as a county highway: Beginning at the northwest corner of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 31; T 12S; R 18 E; which point is on the present Stull County Road; thence south three and one-half miles on the quarter section line to the southwest corner of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 18; T 13 S; R 18 E; which point is on the present Belvoir County Road. Total length petitioned for on this line is three and one-half miles.
