

December 12, 1928

The board of county commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the county clerk present. This being the day set for determining the contested election of trustee of Wakarusa Township as between Geo. Griffith, contestor, and Ed Johnson, contestee, and both interested parties being before the board, the ballots cast for trustee of Wakarusa Township at the general election held Nov. 6, 1928, were opened by the board, counted and tabulated by the county clerk with the following results: Geo. Griffith received 492 votes and Ed Johnson received 512 votes. Ed Johnson having received the largest number of votes cast for Trustee in Wakarusa Township in the general election held Nov. 6, 1928, the Board of County Commissioners declared said Ed Johnson duly elected trustee in the aforesaid township.

On motion properly made and carried the Board of County Commissioners directed the County Clerk to advertise for bids on the construction of bridges and road bed on what is designated as project 50-43-K752 as per plans and specifications on file with the County Clerk and the County Engineer.

On motion properly made and carried the County Clerk was directed to issue warrants to Mary Dwyer, Mary H. Collins, James G. Waddell, H. A. Shannon, Ella I. Shannon, W. J. Shannon, and William Shannon of land damages on U. S. 50, East of Baldwin, when such claims were properly filed and approved by the County Engineer.

The Board of County Commissioner proceeded according with the law in the matter of several election ties resulting from the general election held Nov. 6, 1928. By lot the Board determined the election of R. C. Price as Justice of Peace in Marion township; Glenn Cox, Justice of Peace in Clinton township; Fred Heim, Justice of Peace in Willow Springs township; Geo. McClintock, Justice of Peace in Wakarusa township; Chas. Lewis, Constable in Lecompton township; I. J. Kraft, Constable in Kanwaka township; and Tom Caylor, Constable in Clinton township
