Section 4. The Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, and the Clerk of said County are hereby authorized and directed to prepare and execute the bonds hereinbefore described, and to procure their proper registration in the office of the County Clerk and in the office of the Auditor of the State of Kansas and when so executed and registered, shall be sold and delivered to Commerce Trust Company, of Kansas City, Missouri, the purchaser thereof.

Section 5. The proceeds of the sale of said bonds shall be deposited with the County Treasurer in the special fund heretofore provided for the purpose of paying for the cost of the improvement hereinbefore described.

Section 6. The full faith, credit and resources of the County of Douglas, in the State of Kansas, shall be and the same are hereby irrevocably pledged for the prompt payment of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same matures. For the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds, and for the purpose of paying the principal thereof as the same becomes due, the Board of County Commissioners of said County shall annually levy upon all of the taxable property of the County and of the townships, and upon the property in the benefit districts in the proper proportion, a tax sufficient to produce a fund to pay the interest on said bonds and to pay the principal of said bonds as the same becomes due.

ORDER AND RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

of Douglas County, Kansas, allowing the petition for the Improvement of Lawrence Ottawa of U. S. 73 W. Road in Benefit District No. 3.

Now, upon this 11th day of October 1927, at a duly constituted and regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, and all members of the said Board being present, the petition for the permanent improvement of a certain road, known as Lawrence-Ottawa U. S. 73 W Road, comes up for final consideration and action; and the Board having caused to be published a notice in the Lawrence Daily Journal-World a newspaper of general circulation, on Sept. 22nd 1927, being at least ten days prior to the day of the meeting of this Board for the consideration of the petition, and having carefully examined the said petition, and having carefully examined and caused to be examined the records of this county relating to the lands in said petition described, and after careful inquiry and full consideration, finds as follows:

- (1) That the improvements as prayed for in said petition are of public utility; and
- (2) That said petition is signed by 71 individuals, who constitute more than 51 per cent of the resident landowners owning more than 35 per cent of the land within the district defined by said petition; and
- (3) That said petition designates the road (or roads) to be improved sufficiently by name and by terminal points, and by other specially fixed locations; and
- (4) That said petition definitely designates the lands within the proposed benefit district, also the type or types of permanent improvement and the width (or widths) of the roadway, also the number (or the maximum and minimum number) of annual assessments to be levied upon the lands in the benefit district in payment thereof, and that said petition is in all respects found to be in compliance with the provisions of chapter 265 of the Laws of 1917 and amendments thereto.
