On motion of X. J. Kennedy, Seconded by E. J. Hill the following notice was ordered published:

NOTICE

Proposed Road Improvement in Douglas County, Kansas.

Whereas a petition signed by more than fifty one per cent of the resident land-owners, owning at least thirty-five per cent of the land in the proposed Benefit District, or being more than thirty-five per cent of the resident landowners in the proposed Benefit District owning at least fiftyone per cent of the land in the proposed district, or being the owners of at least sixty per cent of the land in the proposed district, has been filed with the County Clerk of Douglas County, Kansas, praying for the improvement of a certain road in Douglas County, Kansas, known as the Bladwin Road and specifically described as follows:

Beginning near the northwest corner of Section 4, a point in the south right-of-way line of the Highway U. S. No. 50, and in the section line between sections 4 and 5; thence south to the northwest corner of the southwest quarter of section 4; thence east between the northwest quarter and the southwest quarter of section 4 to the Santa Fe railroad tracks; all in T 15 S; R 20 E. And a total distance of approximately three-fourths of a mile.

And said petition being in due and regular form, Therefore

Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regul-r session assembled this 2 day of December, 1929, declare the road described in said petition to be of public utility, and that said road be permanently improved.

Therefore notice is hereby given that on December 16, 1929, at the hour of 11 o'clock A. M., the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, will be in session at their office in the Court House, Lawrence, Kansas, for the purpose of hearing complaint, protests or written objections to the proposed improvements as therein set out, and taking final action on the above resolution.

December 4, 1929.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. Claims against the county were allowed as per Allowance Register.

Moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by E. J. Hill that the County Engineer be and is hereby instructed to lay off all road crews, bridge crews, chief patrolman and materially reduce the County Road and Bridge payroll on account of depleted funds. This order to be effective January 1, 1930.

The above motion was unanimously carried, all Commissioners voting.

December 7, 1929

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk present. The Board completed the allowing of claims presented for the month of November.

The officers of the Douglas County Live Stock and Agricultural Association of Big Springs appeared before the Board in person and by attorney, C. C. Stewart, and protested the Board's action in allowing but one-half the amount paid by the above named Association as premiums for the year 1929.

The Board of Commissioners contend that, under the law, the county is not liable for more than one-half the amount paid during the year 1929.

Moved by Earl T. Black and seconded by X. J. Kennedy that the Claim of the Douglas County ~~Agricultural~~ Live Stock and Agricultural Association's Claim for full payment of premiums for the year 1929 be denied. The motion was then put and carried unanimously. All commissioners voting.

The Board spent the afternoon viewing roads and bridges.

December 11, 1929.

The Board of County Commissioners met in adjourned regular session with all members and the County Clerk Present.

The following road petition filed in the office of the County Clerk came before the Board for consideration.
