The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to published notice in the Lawrence Democrat, Dec. 5, 1929, for the purpose of taking final action on the petition for the permanent inproved of the Baldwin road as decribed in said published notice.

All members of the board, X. J. Kennedy, Chairman, Earl T, Black and E. J. Hill; Commissioners, and the County Clerk being present, and the hour of 11 o'clock having arrived, the petition for the permanent improvement of the Baldwin Road came be fore the board for final action. ORDER AND RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS of Douglas County, Kensas allowing the petition for the Improvement of the Baldwin Road in Palmyre Township.
