The petition for the vacation of the following described road in Willow Springs Township, to-wit: Beginning at a point where U. S. Highway 73W intersects the North line of the Southeast quarter of Sec. 2; T 14S; R 19 B; thence east along the North line of said Southest quarter section line to where the road turns in a northerly line of said Southest quarter section line to where the road times in a northerly direction along west side of creek, and continuong in same northerly direction to a point in the present road fifty feet south of the west end of concrete bridge, known as the Boehle Bridge, across creek, was denied by the Board for the reason that the present road is a necessary travelled road. e northerly direction to

The petition of Felix Tuckel and others for the location of a road described as follows: Beginning at the Mortheast cornerof the South half of the Southeast quarter of section 2 - 14 - 19, a point in the present established Township road, thence due west along the north line of said south half of Southeast quarter un-til it intersects with the U. S. Highway 73W, the point of ending, was denied for the reason that said route is impractible and of no specific benefit to the public. In the matter of viewing the road petitioned for by M. A. Childs and others in Marion Township, the Viewers find as follows: We, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, acting as viewers of a road petitioned for by M. A, Childs and others in Marion Township,met at the point of beginning if said petitioned road on the February 7, 1930, and pro-ceeded to view said route, or as near as we consider practical, and we recommend as follows: That a public road be laid out and established as follows: Beginning at a point where the Lone Star County Road intersects with the west line of the MBi of Sec. S. - 14 - 18; thence forth along the i line to the NW corner of the MBi of said section 1, then in a Morthwestarly direction to the property owned by the Lone Star and Gun Club in the SNiof Sec. 36-13 -18, the point of ending. We further recommend that the road be forty feet wide and that demaged to property owners be allowed as follows: To Roy Flory, for land and all other damages, the sum of \$400; to W. F. Saith, for land and all other damages, \$150; to J. W. Gorbett, damages, \$1.00.
